Ebola vaccine, 100% effectiveness

An experimental Ebola vaccine tested on thousands of people in Guinea has proven to be 100% effective.

The study involved vaccinating close contacts of patients who had contracted the virus.

Two groups had been given the vaccine, one group immediately and the other 3 weeks after contracting the virus.

The Canadian government and the pharmaceutical company Merck have developed the vaccine.

World's first 3D drug

To go ahead has been given for the world's first 3D printed drug.

The drug will treat seizures brought on by epilepsy in adults and children.

The drug was developed using Pennsylvania-based Aprelia Pharmaceuticals's proprietary [ZipDose technology](#). ZipDose is a 3D printer that creates pills by printing out thin layers of medicine in powder form, with layers of a water-based binder spread between each of the powder layers. The result is a tablet that can dissolve with a sip of water in less than five seconds.

Two are added to Drug Tariff's category M

Aripiprazole and eplerenone are the latest additions to the Recent Launches in Figure 1, marking their inclusion in category M of the Drug Tariff of pharmacy-reimbursement prices from 1 July. While the former's lowest trade price for the 10mg strength reacted strongly to the move, with a steep 22% fall last month, the latter's average and lowest prices were relatively steady. Donepezil and desloratadine, the oldest members of the list, have made way for them.
